

What Data Should Be Public The Sunlight Foundation created this living set of open data guidelines to address: what data should be public, how to make data public, and how to implement policy. The provisions are not ranked in order of priority and do not address every question one should consider when preparing a policy, but are a guide to answer the question of what an open data policy can and should do in striving to create a government data ecosystem where open data is the default. Setting the default to open means that the government and parties acting on its behalf will make public information available proactively and that they'll put that information within reach of the public (online), without barriers for its reuse and consumption. 





- By making data easily discoverable, no special relationships or political clout are needed for access.




